Autumn Term	Topic	Brief description
Physical Topic I	Challenge of Natural Hazards (Tectonics, Weather and Climate Change)	Pupils will discover why earthquakes and volcanic eruptions occur and how they differ across the world. Tropical storms and why they happen will be explored. Pupils will look at the evidence for climate change and how it can be managed.
Physical Topic 2	The Living Environment (Ecosystems, Tropical Rainforests and Hot Deserts)	Pupils will look at what an ecosystem is with a particular focus on tropical rainforests and hot deserts.
Spring Term Physical Topic 3	Topic (UK Physical Landscapes, Coasts and Rivers)	Brief description Pupils will be able to locate the major upland/lowland areas of the UK. They will explore how the coastline of the UK has developed over time. Finally they will look at how rivers shape our landscape.
Summer Term Human Topic I	Topic Urban Issues and Challenges	Brief description Pupils will investigate the reasons why so many people across the world live in cities. Opportunities and challenges of living in a city will be studied. UK cities and a focus on how they can promote sustainable urban living.
